We pray that our leaders and politicians and those with the power and ability make real efforts to recognise and help the poorest in society. Lord in your Mercy: Hear our Prayer

Let us pray for all who mourn that they may be comforted. We remember all who are sick, those in hospital and those who are housebound. We remember especially the sick of our own parish congregation and our own families wherever they may be. Lord in your Mercy: Hear our **Prayer**

Let us ask Mary the Mother of the Lord to pray with us: Hail Mary...
